Wandering through HSSB 1207, there isn't much to wander through – it's a standard classroom with 30-ish desks, a projector, and a chalkboard. However, Green Thumb is set to bring wonder to this room with the June 8th premiere of their debut film, *Devereux Beach*, with its intimate portrayals and reflections of the beach that form an integral part of Santa Barbara life.

Devereux Beach is a multimedia film consisting of five chapters pieced together by poetry. Each chapter is a different depiction of beach experiences through varied mediums – whether it be footage of a person playing fetch with their dog or an experimental animation of words as

waves. Much like taking a walk on the beach, the film is a meditative and pensive experience, conjuring reflections on the community's relationship with the beach as well as their impact on it.

"So many interactions between so many people over the years have taken place in the same spot, yet the environment continues to remain and replenish itself," says Marley Morales, a member of the Green Thumb Collective, "our human imprint is so important to think about". The five chapters of *Devereux Beach* certainly form five waves that wash over and reshape the audience's perceptions of our beach.

Devereux Beach was created under the prestigious Allison Brown Visual Arts Fellowship's emphasis on site-specific and community engaged art, a fellowship that Green Thumb was selected for this past March. In this fellowship, Group Green Thumb Collective explored environmentally-informed art and artists, with this scholarship being reflected in their clear reference of Brie Ruais's *Digging In*, *Digging Out* in one of the film's chapters.

About Group Green Thumb Collective

Green Thumb is an artist collective interested in exploring collective member's individual experiences with the world around them in dialogue with the communities they occupy. Green Thumb Collective re-shapes, re-molds, and re-forms their own and their own community's thoughts, experiences, and reflections to create art to serve as a communal reflection and revelation by making a film. Consisting of five members, all with different creative experience and backgrounds, the Green Thumb Collective brings new perspectives and ideas to the art world.
